Examples of Entry Level Jobs in Newborn Screening

Data Entry Operator

- Enters patient, specimen, and test information into the laboratory computer system.
- Verifies patient/specimen demographics and information.
- Run end-of-day reports, run newborn screen queries, pick up newborn screen submission forms, and respond to emails from lab personnel in a timely manner.

Laboratory Technician

- Receives and processes specimens and samples received at the laboratory.
- Enter test requests, search for patient demographic information, and track information for cataloging and auditing purposes.
- Completes and documents all required quality control steps.

Public Health and Prevention Specialist

- Follow-up on infants and children with one or more of the disorders identified by the newborn screen to coordinate re-testing, evaluation, and treatment.
- Educate others on relevant literature, guidelines, protocols, and other information about the program and the screened disorders.
- Preferred skills: Knowledge of, and ability to work with confidential medical records/files/information. Skill to perform tasks with a high degree of accuracy and pay close attention to detail. Ability to handle specimens and samples quickly, accurately, and safely. Ability to follow standard operating procedures and protocols accurately.



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
