ANNUAL SUMMARY OF MORBIDITY REPORTS FOR 1980

Morbidity totals published in this report represent the final figures on the reported incidence of notifiable diseases during 1980. Week number 1 of each year is the week containing January 4th; therefore, the actual period of time included in the reporting year of 1980 extended from December 30, 1979, through January 3, 1981, and consisted of 53 standard report weeks (defined as Sunday through Saturday). The cumulative totals published in "Texas Morbidity This Week," Week number 53, ending January 3, 1981, may differ somewhat from the totals presented in this report. The addition of delayed reports, removal of duplicate reports, and other updates made to the morbidity files account for these differences.

The morbidity figures in this report represent cases reported to the Texas Department of Health from approximately 500 reporting agents throughout Texas. The methods of collecting morbidity data during 1980 were similar to those of previous years, and because the basic reporting mechanisms have remained consistent over time, the data may be compared with previous years.

These figures include only notifiable diseases reported in residents of Texas, and the county totals indicate county of residence of the case rather than county of disease occurrence or county of reporting agent. Reports of notifiable diseases occurring in out-of-state residents were referred through an interstate reciprocal notification system to the appropriate state health departments for investigative and reporting purposes. Cases referred through this system are not included in this summary.

CURRENT TRENDS IN REPORTABLE DISEASES

Significant decreases in the number of reported cases of the following immunizable diseases were noted in 1980: measles (181 cases) decreased 73% from 670 cases in 1979; rubella (131 cases) decreased 38% from 212 cases in 1979; mumps (212 cases) decreased 77% from 908 cases in 1979; and pertussis (82 cases) decreased 21% from 104 cases in 1979. These were also the lowest numbers of immunizable diseases recorded by the Texas Department of Health since reporting began.

It is also important to note that no cases of the following diseases were reported in Texas residents during 1980:

Anthrax	Plague
Botulism	Poliomyelitis, paralytic
Cholera	Rabies in man
Epidemic typhus	Yellow fever

While some diseases (primarily those which are immunizable) showed a decrease in the number of reported cases, others showed an increase (Table 1). It is not known to what extent improved reporting may have been responsible for this increase in reported cases. The

number of reported cases of endemic (murine) typhus in Texas increased from 59 cases in 1979 to 61 cases in 1980; this number was the highest reported since 64 cases were reported in 1954.

The number of reported cases of amebiasis (355 in 1980) increased from the 301 cases reported in 1979 and was the greatest number reported since 427 cases were reported in Texas during 1965.

Sixty-eight cases of St. Louis encephalitis were reported in 1980 compared to the five (5) cases reported in 1979, resulting in an increase in incidence from 0.04 cases per 100,000 population in 1979 to 0.48 per 100,000 population in 1980. The five cases which occurred in 1979 were scattered geographically; 86% of the cases in 1980 were related to two focal outbreaks which occurred in Harris County (52 cases) and Jefferson County (7 cases).

The first case of diphtheria in Texas since 1977 was reported in 1980. This case, which resulted in death, occurred in an unimmunized refugee child who was four years of age.

Preparations are currently underway for the publication entitled "Reported Morbidity and Mortality in Texas--1980 Annual Summary." This report will provide additional epidemiological descriptions of communicable disease activity in Texas, incidence rates, mortality data, and an overview of special surveillance activities conducted by the Epidemiology Division during 1980.
