

# PCC EMS Report

July 2024

- Staffing shortage continues to be an issue for EMS Providers and Hospitals throughout Texas and the Nation. Senate Bill 8 (SB 8) provides 21.7 million dollars for EMS Recruitment and Retention project, funding for EMS scholarships in rural and underserved areas of Texas. DSHS partner with Regional Advisory Councils (RAC) and EMS Education programs and EMS Providers to provide scholarships for candidates. This project is making progress throughout Texas:
  - I. New Statewide Career website, <https://EMS.texas.gov>
  - II. Currently 2,947 scholarships have been processed, total \$15.7 million.
  - III. As of 7-01-2024 there are 8,830 more certified EMS personnel than there were in 2022.
  - IV. EMS Recruitment campaign material was developed and provided to each of the Regional Advisory Council.
- As of November 20, 2023, the Texas EMS Registry system upgraded to V3.5. We are still in need of 54 EMS Providers to complete the onboarding process but are making good progress.
