

AQUATIC LIFE ORDER NUMBER 15

Pursuant to Chapter 436 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, it is hereby ORDERED that: Samples of fish collected from Lake Como, Tarrant County —covered by Aquatic Life Order AL-10 issued by the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) (formerly the Texas Department of Health) on April 5, 1995— indicate that the levels of chlordane, DDE, dieldrin, and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) have decreased to an acceptable level. Consumption of fish from Lake Como no longer poses a threat to human health. Therefore, the Aquatic Life Order AL-10 for Lake Como is hereby rescinded. This order is effective at 12:01 a.m., September 25, 2007, and remains in full force and effect until modified or rescinded by further written order.
